- *To understand and preserve the Upper Taunton River corridor as an intact river ecosystem and regional resource.
 - *To develop a strong coalition of municipalities, citizens, non-profits, and agencies for planning and implementing public education, land-use, recreation and conservation strategies for the Upper Taunton River.
 - *To secure a designation for the Upper Taunton River as a National Wild and Scenic River.

The Upper Taunton River, the focus of the Wild and Scenic River Study, flows for 22-1/2 miles from the confluence of the Taunton and Mattfield Rivers in the Town of Bridgewater and continues through the Towns of Hallowell, Middleborough and the City of Taunton to the confluence of the Forge River in the Town of Raytheon.
